Librarian's Report

This month the Special District Association made it possible for all members to join Amazon Business Prime. We have signed the library up for this account and believe it will be beneficial as we order many of our programming and office supplies from there. I attended a webinar hosted by the SDA on this added benefit to their membership. I also attended a webinar hosted by Streamline, the company our website is through. The webinar was on the upcoming enforcement of House Bill 21-1110, which states that government websites must be ADA compliant. Streamline is beta testing a service that remediates all documents and files to ensure compliance. I signed up for the service while it was on waitlisting and was able to use it to format everything on our website, most notably Board minutes and agendas.

I have released a survey to the community on the library building and have received results, I will keep it open longer so that as many people as possible have the chance to fill it out. We have it digitally and in paper.

Staff will receive a raise this month that was approved by the Board at the beginning of this year.

High Rise Tree Service put up the shades in the courtyard and will take them down in the fall. This is a much safer alternative than library staff attempting to do it. The courtyard also received beautiful flowers from local Girl Scouts Troop 13082, you can see them in the wall planters! Pinnacle Glass fixed a few doors we were having issues with, so all are in good working condition.

We have teamed up with MACC this summer to offer every child that attends all storytime readings of Matilda a free ticket to their showing of the play in August. This is a great community collaboration!
